3. Completion of five elements, in this order.
 - a. Four self-paced E-Learnings (requires registration in the LPHI LMS)
 - b. Three days of classroom training (May 8, 9 and 14, 2019, 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM, Westborough, MA-more details and directions to follow)
 - c. One virtual training inspection
 - d. Five supervised field inspections with a field trainer
 - e. Online final assessment
